Candidate Q&A: Dan DeMichele

1. Why do you want to serve on the PDPOA Board of Directors -- and is there anything in particular you would like to accomplish?

I want to have a chance to help build a stronger sense of community for the PD owners while helping balance the needs of the short term renters. Palmetto Dunes has much to offer, and I'd like to help execute on existing plans and create new ways for owners to get to know each other.

2. What skills and experiences do you believe you can contribute to the Board -- and more generally to Palmetto Dunes?

As a software executive my main responsibilities are taking in requirements from a number of constituents, understanding market dynamics, and then turning those into the most prioritized list for the company to execute on.
