RE: Deer Harvest Recommendation

Dear Mr. Schumacher:

Thank you for the opportunity to conduct spotlight surveys in Palmetto Dunes last month. The September 2021 survey estimated that there are 97 deer per square mile (deer/mi²) in Palmetto Dunes. This is a high deer density. For comparison, the typical deer density for the surrounding coastal plain region of South Carolina is approximately 30-45 deer/mi².

Given the absence of significant natural predators of deer within the community and the relatively high fawn/doe ratio (0.56), it is almost certain that the deer population within Palmetto Dunes will increase in future years unless a deer harvest is implemented.

The decision to harvest deer should be based not only on the deer density, but also on the level of deer damage (landscape shrubbery damage, deer-vehicle collisions, etc.) and the tolerance levels of Palmetto Dunes residents. The resident survey conducted last year provides great information on the community's attitudes and perceptions regarding deer.

I would recommend initiating a small-scale deer harvest of 30 deer this winter using sharpshooting. The harvest should focus almost exclusively on female deer if possible. Beginning a harvest program now will keep deer numbers at manageable levels going forward.

I would strongly recommend continuing to do deer surveys annually to monitor changes in density over time. Typically, these surveys are done twice per year (September/October and November/December) for 3 nights during each survey period. These surveys will provide critical data on deer density trends and help to assess the effectiveness of the harvest program.
